

What to do...

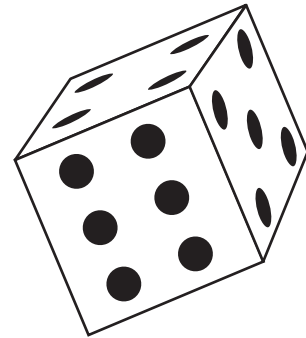
1. Each person writes five numbers between 10 and 3 on a piece of paper.
2. You can write a number twice.
3. Draw a circle round each number.
4. Take turns to throw a dice.
5. Look at the number on the dice – what must be added to it to make ten?
6. If you have the answer on your paper, cross it out.
7. First one to cross out all five numbers is the Bingo winner!

Bingo for learning!

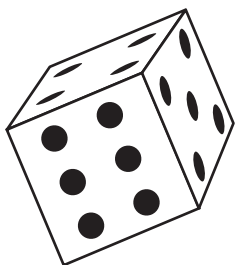
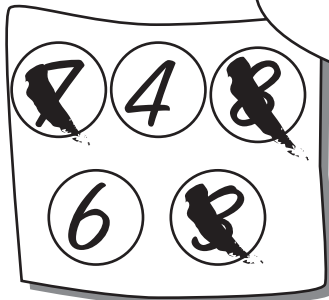
This activity helps children learn the pairs of numbers which add to make ten, $5 + 5$, $6 + 4$, $7 + 3$, $8 + 2$, $9 + 1$. Help children use their fingers to find the number that goes with the dice throw to make ten each time.
