

What to do...

Play this game with a partner – you will need a dice and a crayon.

1. Throw a dice and count the number of dots.
2. Colour that number of dots on your set of sixes! You may ONLY colour dots on ONE six.
3. Keep playing until one player has coloured all the dots on all six of their sixes. (This is not easy since sometimes you may throw a number on the dice, which you cannot colour on just one six.)
4. If you cannot colour anything, you miss that turn!

Make six!

This activity helps children to add pairs of numbers to make six. We want children to know that $3 + 3$, and $4 + 2$ and $5 + 1$ and $6 + 0$ make six without them even having to think about it!

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Oh, snuffling sandflies! I have thrown a four and I only have three dots left to colour!
