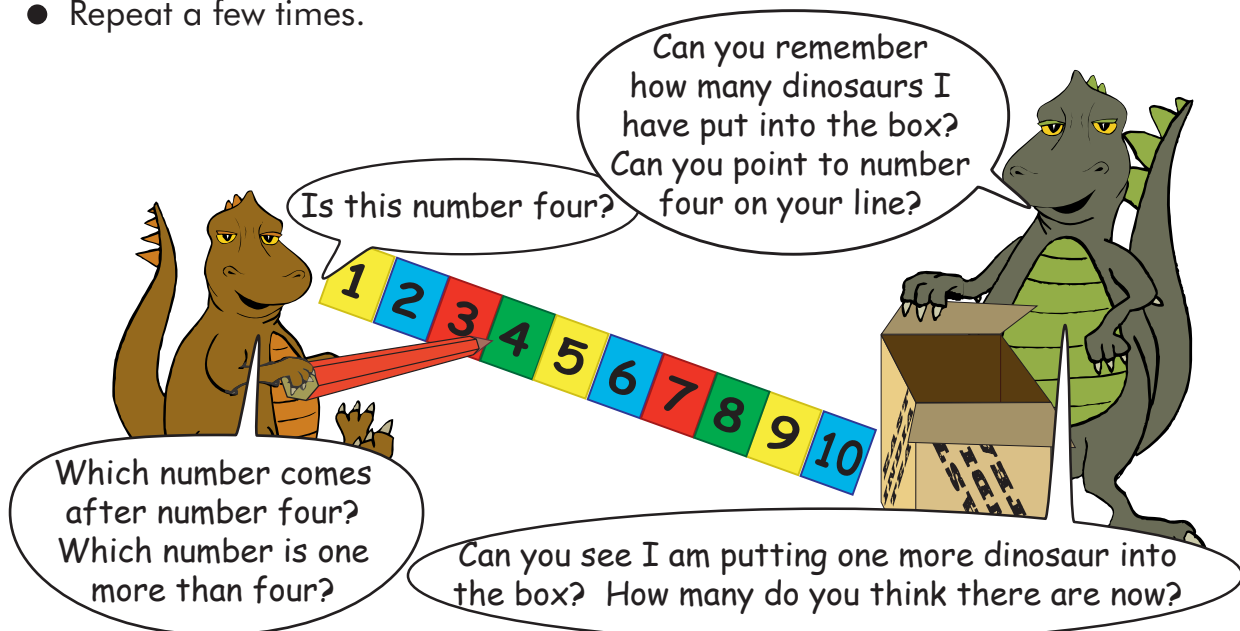


One more dinosaur

You will need: Numbered dinosaur cards, 12 toy dinosaurs or counters and a box

- What to do:**
- Place the dinosaur number cards in order. Say each number as it is put in the line.
 - Count along the line touching each number as it is said.
 - Place four dinosaurs/counters in a box. Count the dinosaurs/counters as you put them in the box.
 - Put one more dinosaur/counter into the box.
 - How many dinosaurs are there now? Which number is one more than four? Point to the number on the number line.
 - Repeat a few times.



This activity helps your child to count up to 12 and to find one more than a number from one to 10. Help your child to count and lay the cards in order from one to 12. Encourage them to count as you put the dinosaurs/counters into the box. If your child finds this easy try adding two more dinosaurs/counters to the box. Remember to always use the number line. This activity will also build your child's confidence with numbers.

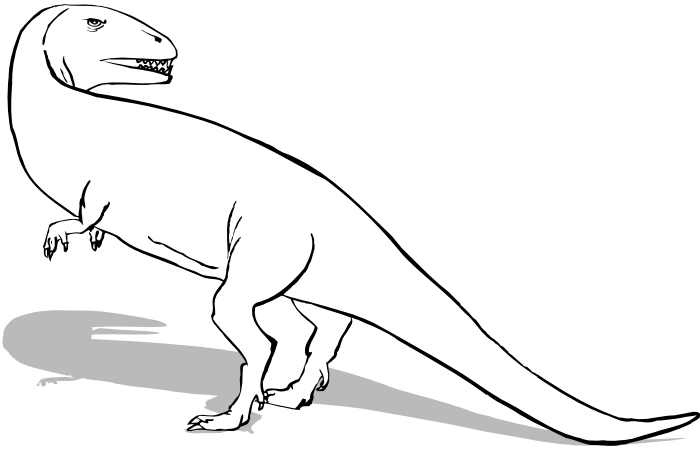

(tie-ran-oh-saw-rus)

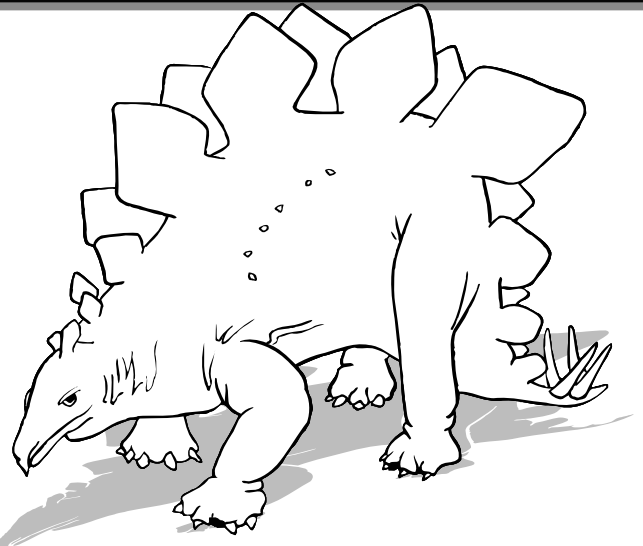

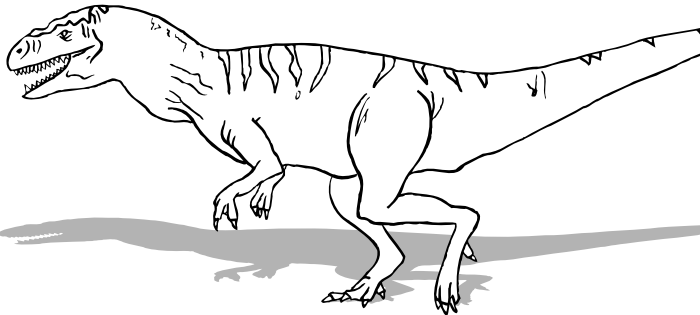

(all-oh-saw-rus)

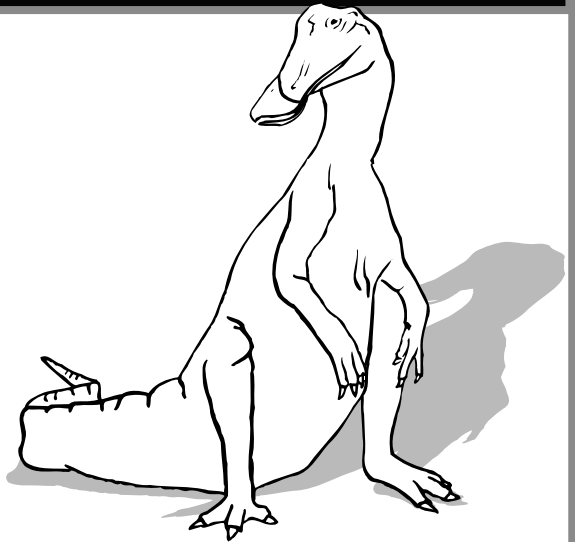

(had-ro-saw-rus)

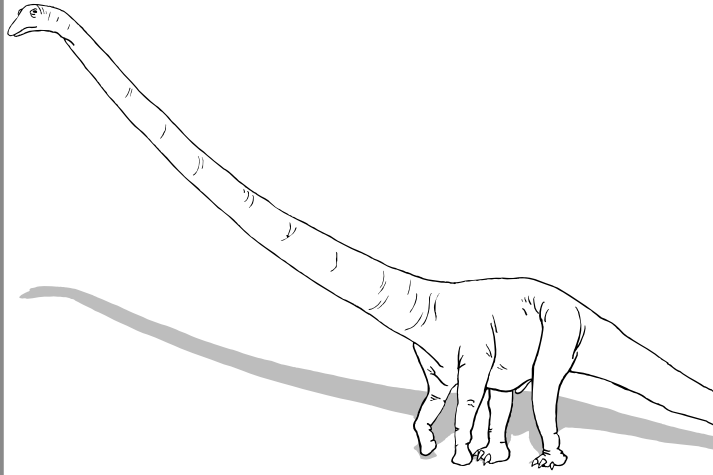

(dip-lod-oh-kus)

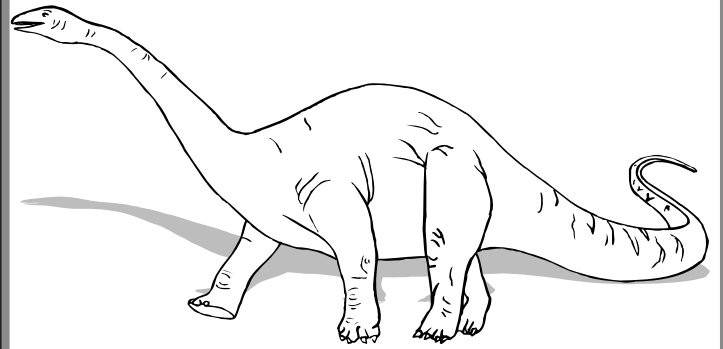

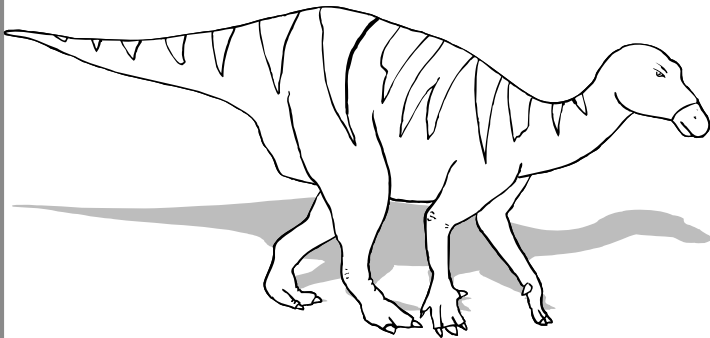

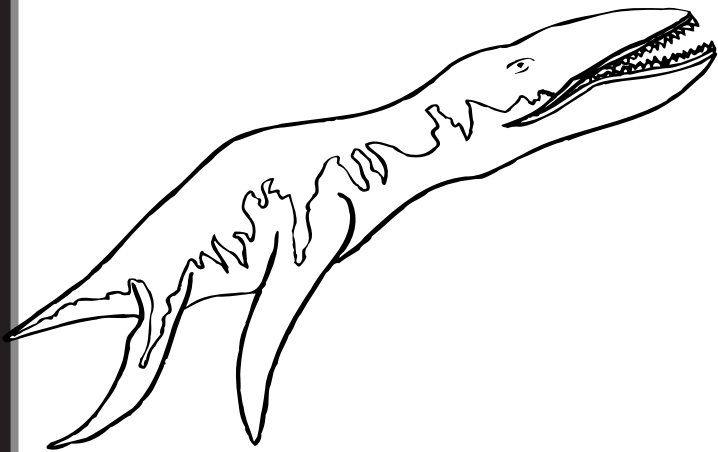

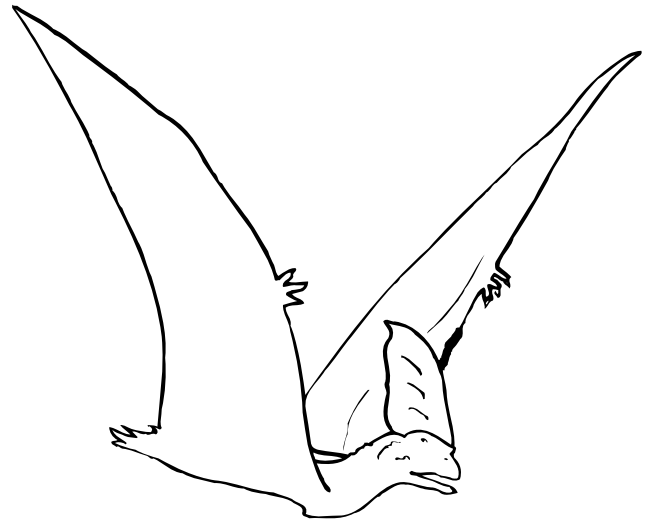

(brak-ee-oh-saw-rus)

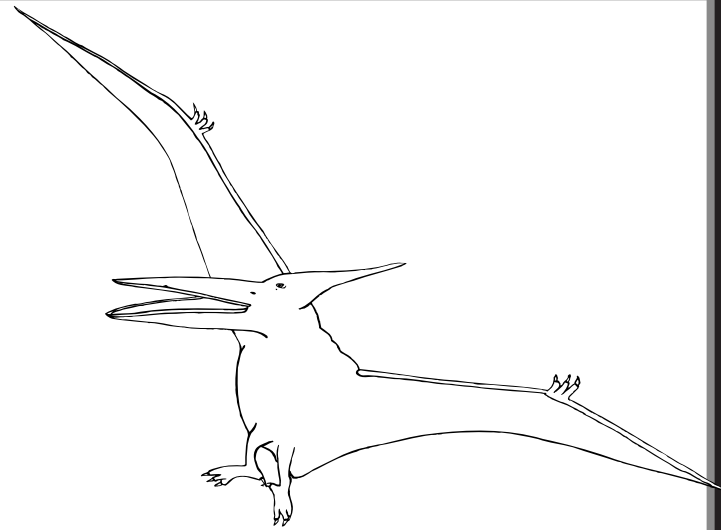
